

Pre-Algebra Syllabus

Course Description

This Pre-Algebra course focuses on preparing students for success in Algebra and Geometry studies by establishing a solid foundational understanding of number sense. Topics during this year will include factors, percentages, angles, triangles, one variable equations, graphing, inequalities, probability, and data analysis.

Academic Honesty

Livingston Classical Cyber Academy students are expected to carry themselves with integrity. Cheating of any manner will not be permitted. Class Expectations

Homework

Homework will be assigned on a daily basis as it allows for independent student learning and practice for mastery. **Homework is a communication tool**. It communicates to the teacher that the student understands the material presented during the previous lessons or it communicates what areas need further instruction and clarification.

Homework will be collected and graded daily. Late work is not accepted and will result in a zero for that assignment. Class Procedures:

- 1. Pick up the contents of the student folder before sitting down.
- 2. Selected students begin homework demonstrations. Remaining students begin homework corrections.
- 3. Listen and participate respectfully during lessons.
- 4. If a student is late to class, place the tardy slip in the "Tardy-Box" and quietly sit down. If the tardy student misses homework correction time, that student must submit their (uncorrected) homework in the "Turn-In-Box" to receive credit.
- 5. Students must actively participate through the entire class until Mrs. Kent dismisses students.

Bathroom use: students must sign out before leaving the classroom. There is no leaving for the restroom during the last 10 minutes of class. Use this privilege wisely!

Student Folders:

Students will each be provided a folder which contains materials that must be picked up at the beginning of each class. In the folder will be any graded assignments, new handouts, or paperwork that the student missed while absent. It is the student's responsibility to check the folder each day.

Do not submit assignments in this folder, as Mrs. Kent will not check them for items to be collected or that need to be graded. Use the "Turn-In-Box" to submit assignments.

Required Materials

- 3-ring binder
- Loose leaf paper (no spiral bound)
- Pencils (work will not be accepted if written in pen)
- Erasers
- Red pen for correcting work
- · Basic, four-function calculator
- Graphing calculator*

Students are expected to bring these materials and their course workbook to class each day. Every student will be required to keep an organized binder that includes the notes of the lessons covered in class, as well as old quizzes, tests, and corrected homework. This binder will be used as a study guide for future assessments, as well as an aid in completing homework assignments.

*Note, LCCA will be providing a classroom set of graphing calculators to use while in school, but it is strongly recommended that the student have one available for work at home. The classroom model is Texas Instruments TI-84 Plus CE, however any model from Texas Instruments that begins with "TI-84" would be compatible.

Grades:

The course grade will be determined as follows:

- Homework/Classwork 30%
- Quizzes 30%
- Tests 20%
- Semester Exam 20%

The Grading Scale will follow LCA policy (with no rounding) as follows:

- 90-100% A
- 80-89% B
- 70-79% C
- 60-69% D
- Below 60% F

Absences:

If a student is absent, any assignments due the day of the absence must be turned in the day the students return. The student will then have 1 day for each day absent to make up and turn in any work assigned during the absence.

NOTE: Since tests are announced at least one week in advance, being absent on the day before a test does not excuse a student from taking the scheduled test if they are in school on test day.
